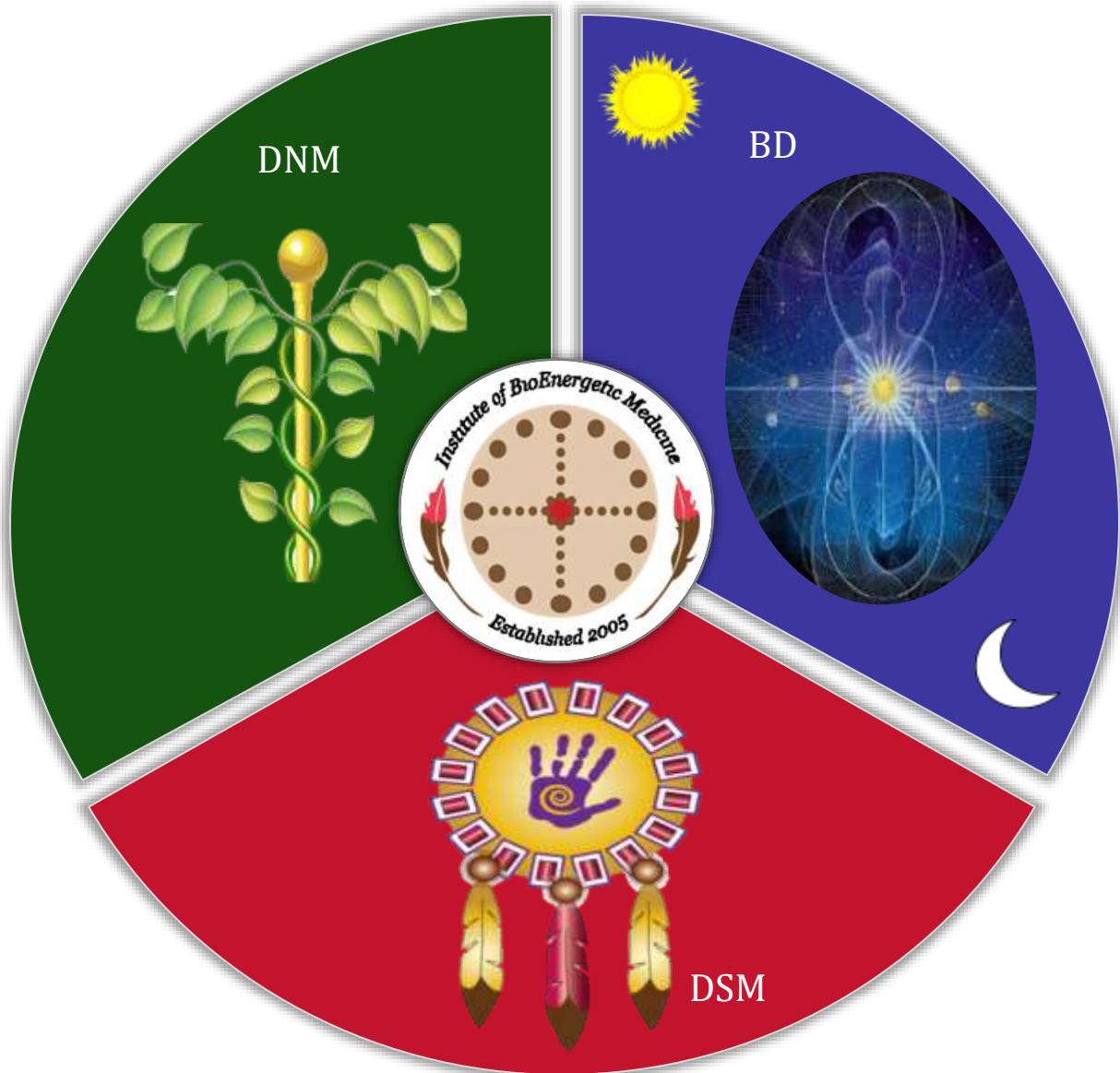


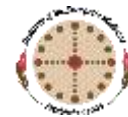

 - These are the in-class/virtual class practicum hours
- Research/Self-study hours (R/SS)
 - These are the required self-study hours outside the in-class/virtual class schedule
- Clinical hours (CL)
 - These are the client practice hours

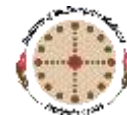
AURICULAR THERAPY COURSES

Upon completion of all coursework and labs each student is prepared to take the (ACI) Auriculotherapy Certification International exam offered during the IBEM class time. Students are also welcomed to take the exam on their own.

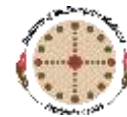
BIOFEEDBACK THERAPY CERTIFICATE , 420 Hours

Program Objective: The graduate should be able to acquire an entry-level position, work as self-employed or contracted biofeedback therapist.

BIOFEEDBACK COURSES

The IBEM Biofeedback Program contains four modules of intensive coursework and practicum labs to provide our students with a comprehensive biofeedback classroom experience. You will be expected to attend class three days (Friday, Saturday, and Sunday) a month for five months.

Advanced Traditional Biofeedback Program (2nd Year)



Upon completion of all coursework and labs each student is prepared to take the basic biofeedback diploma exam in the first year and will be prepared to take the CBP (Certified Biofeedback Practitioner) exam offered during the IBEM class time in the second year. Students are also welcomed to take the exam on their own.

Addictions Workshop is an elective class which First Year, non-doctoral students may elect to take.

PROFESSIONAL DEGREE PROGRAMS

DOCTOR OF NATURAL MEDICINE (DNM)

BIOENERGETIC DOCTORATE (BD)

DOCTOR OF SACRED MEDICINE (DSM)

These Professional Degree Programs reflect three levels or tripartite orders of a healing ministry. The “Sacred” means set apart for a holy purpose.

DOCTOR OF NATURAL MEDICINE (DNM)

DNMs prefer a vitalist Bioenergetic Model. Natural Medicine is often called Vital Energy Medicine. The word medicine does not refer to drugs, but the Native American term for “power” and is based on indigenous medicine such as that practiced by ancient cultures, including Native American medicine. It traces its history to the 12th century to Paracelsus, who is considered the “Father of Natural Medicine” who advocated using natural methods of healing to stimulate the Vital Life Force (Bioenergy) in the human body to heal itself (self-regulation). He was convinced that the best way to stay healthy was to live a simple, natural lifestyle in harmony with nature for healing.

Modern day DNMs study anatomy, physiology, pathophysiology, biochemistry, Bioenergetics, nutrition, exercise, herbals, homeopathy, various mind, and body techniques such as mediation, and visualization, affirmations, the use of sound, and light (especially sunlight and full spectrum light), traditional biofeedback, relaxation techniques, breathing exercises, and reflex techniques, as well as light percussion, nutrition, herbals, Voll technology, and professional ethics. Natural Medicine places importance on “Nature relatedness” and “Nature connectivity” and sees many health imbalances as a “Nature Deficit Syndrome”.



Natural Medicine sees Bioenergetic imbalances as determining factors such as poor mental health behavioral excesses, toxins, physical excesses, as well as deficiencies. The main determining factor is often spiritual, as in violating a spiritual principle resulting in guilt, such as lying, cheating, stealing, unfaithfulness, lack of purpose in life, lack of community involvement, lack of connectivity to nature, or to a higher power than oneself.

The emphasis on the spiritual determining cause of illness is somewhat unique to DNMs, most of whom are also often ordained clerics with a ministry in natural healing methods. In fact, most DNMs claim a divine or religious right to practice natural medicine and cite the Holy Scriptures as the basis for that religious right, noting that there are over 600 scriptural verses that mention herbs or herbal oils, given to humanity, for healing by God; Ezekiel 47:12; Revelations 22:2. Even Auricular Therapy is mentioned in the Bible, Leviticus 14:17.

(Dr. Stewart BS, DNM, an ordained minister, and author of “The Healing Oils of the Bible”).

Bioenergetic imbalances are seen as causing either too much energy or not enough energy in certain areas of the body. The goal of the DNM is to help the client to self-regulate such energy. DNMs are taught to refer and work with other healthcare practitioners and to not represent who they are as anything but a DNM.

The DNM is a recognized healthcare practitioner throughout the world, including by WHO and is not to be confused with the ND, or NMD. NDs seek licensure by states, and DNMs prefer not to be licensed.

BIOENERGETIC DOCTORATE (BD)

The BD (Bioenergetic Doctor), the second sacred order of the healing ministry, embraces Natural Medicine, with a special emphasis on Bioenergetic philosophy, science and practice (art). Its philosophical roots are deep and very ancient, in accordance with most indigenous traditions of the priest/ physician. This philosophical tradition embraces the mother of all sciences, the Celestial Science, specifically Astral Stellar Medicine. Just as Traditional Chinese Medicine embraces the concept of Heavenly Qi (heavenly energy) so does Bioenergetic Medicine. And similarly, the BD recognizes the innate Bioenergy, or Vital Life Force in all living organisms, including human beings. Indeed, as Native Americans often say, “all our relations”. The BD does not see a person as sick because he or she has a disease, but, instead, sees the person as having a disease, because the person is sick. This “sickness” is the prime disease, the fundamental Dis-ease, meaning out of balance. The Vital Life Force or Bioenergy (“bio”, meaning, life) is out of balance. In modern scientific terms, the individual is out of homeostasis, which is controlled by the individual’s nervous system, that, in turn can result in one or more



diseases. The goal of Bioenergetic Medicine is to restore this balance, not treat a vast array of medical diseases. Once balance is restored diseases often disappear, according to Bioenergetic philosophy. The Science of Bioenergetic Medicine is the study and application (Art) of Bioenergetic modalities that include electromagnetic, light, and sound modalities to name a few.

DOCTOR OF SACRED MEDICINE (DSM)

The DSM order completes the Sacred Triplicity levels. This third order can be likened to what is often called the theologian in various religions. The DSM is the recognized teacher of Natural Wholistic Bioenergetic Medicine, the Bioenergetic Philosopher. He or she, in addition, to his or her healing ministry, is the sacred counselor and can perform the sacred rites should he or she so chose. One cannot reach this level without having attained the previous two, the DNM and the BD. Thus, the DSM is a Tripartite degree, requiring three degrees, DNM, BD, and DSM. Certain individuals, however, recognized by IBEM may be awarded an honorary DSM based on experience, knowledge, and his or her contribution to society. IBEM, in keeping with indigenous spiritual tradition does not charge for the DSM degree.

DOCTORAL CANDIDATES

All Doctoral candidates must complete the first year of the Auricular and Biofeedback programs. They must also complete and pass the Auriculotherapy Certification International (ACI) exam and Diploma Basic Biofeedback Practitioner Exam before being eligible to continue into the second year of the doctorate program.

It is important to note that our program is dynamic. We will add and remove courses as needed to stay current with evidence-based science in natural health.

NOTE: The second year also leads to the advanced level of Traditional Biofeedback and the Certified Biofeedback Practitioner (CBP) exam.

Dissertation

In addition to the required coursework for the BD, DNM and DSM, a dissertation must be completed for these degrees. The dissertation is to be completed in the fourth year. The dissertation topic is to be approved by a member of the dissertation committee. Dissertation



guidelines and template are provided by IBEM faculty to be used for completion of this requirement.

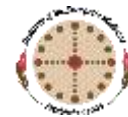
FALL SYMPOSIUM

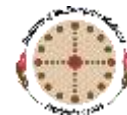

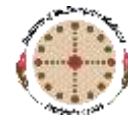
